In the winter semester 2016/17, I taught the E-Master course "Hunger in Scandinavian Literature" together with Thomas Esser, and in the winter semester 2020/21, I taught the E-Master course "Species - Animals in Scandinavian Literature from 1900 onwards" alone. And in retrospect, I can say that I did a lot of things wrong during the first course, because at that time, there wasn't really much use of video conferencing in online teaching. And that turned out to be very helpful for the second course, because it was very clear to me, how online teaching should be planned, above all to strengthen this aspect of encounter among the students, which is also a great strength of this programme. And video conferencing can actually be used very well for this. This option for group work also worked very well and I also outsourced group work via additional online tools such as Etherpads and that also worked very well. That is actually something that I will probably take back with me in part even in the classroom teaching. What was particularly nice about this cooperation was that the collaboration of students from different universities and sometimes with very different prerequisites worked very well. And my students have also reported back that they found it very enriching.
